# THE MEDIEVAL MANUSCRIPTS OF TRINITY COLLEGE, OXFORD: A DESCRIPTIVE CATALOGUE

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### SCRIBES AND SCRIPT

Textualis semi-quadrata, a bold and weighty hand. Seemingly one scribe. Marginal annotation by several hands, s. xiv–xv, in (a)–(e) as detailed under Contents. Late medieval pointing hands (e.g. 26<sup>r</sup>, 84<sup>r</sup>).

### DECORATION

The start of (a) is marked by a decorated initial, 6 lines high, adorned with simple foliate curls, accompanied by long border extensions, pink, red, blue, and gold. Each subsequent incipit is headed by a two-colour (red and blue) initial, 6+ lines high, flourished in both colours, with penwork extensions and 'waterfalls' in the borders. Subdivisions are marked by 2-line-high initials, generally blue flourished in red but sometimes red flourished in blue. Red and blue paraphs throughout. Running headings in red and blue capitals, flanked by simple penwork curls in red, blue, or both. Diagrams

(all fairly crudely done): within text block on 140°, 148°, 150°, 151°; added to margins on 165°, 166°, and (even weaker) 178°. Drolleries, informally added to edges of text by an early corrector or annotator on 10°, 79°, 81°, 82°, 84°, 85°, 86°, and 94°; motifs include dragons, a hooded beast-head, hybrids, serpents, and human heads (that on 81° with three faces in which the beard of one forms the hair of the next). Drawing of 'heraldic' swan rampant (or of a swan badge), added s. xvi to the formerly blank 252°.

# PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION

Parchment: stout and fairly even; flaws rare. Arranged HF, FH. Damp damage (mottled mould spotting) along the bottom margin of most leaves (causing some loss of text from 166 to 173). Fols. i (modern parchment) + 173 + i (modern parchment, foliated '174', currently detached). Modern pencil foliation.

Size:  $367-70 \times 250$  mm. Written area:  $282 \times 161$  mm. Two columns (width: 75 mm). Lines: 41 (space, 7 mm; height of minims, 3 mm). Pricking: awl; done in both side margins. Ruling: lead or crayon. Double verticals at either side of text block; triple in the intercolumnar space. First, third, last, and antepenultimate horizontals extended.

Collation: preliminary leaves (I-2)<sup>2</sup>; I-XX<sup>8</sup>; XXI<sup>II</sup> (= 12 with leaf 12 cancelled). Contemporary signatures (roman numeral flanked by dots) final verso, lower margin, centre. Preserved from 'III' (26<sup>V</sup>) onwards, the system evidently started with fols. 3–10 as

I—ignoring the bifolium with preface and capitula list. In addition, a '.C.' appears beside the '.XI.' on 90°.

Book II starts on 16<sup>v</sup>, III prologue on 26<sup>r</sup>, III on 26<sup>v</sup>, IV on 37<sup>v</sup>, V prologue on 49<sup>v</sup>, V on 50<sup>r</sup>, VI on 59<sup>v</sup>, VII on 71<sup>r</sup>, VIII on 83<sup>r</sup>, IX on 94<sup>v</sup>, X on 105<sup>r</sup>, XI on 115<sup>r</sup>, XII prologue on 130<sup>v</sup>, XII on 131<sup>r</sup>, XIII prologue on 143<sup>r</sup>, XIV on 158<sup>v</sup>. Fol. 173<sup>v</sup> is blank.

# SCRIBES AND SCRIPT

Proto-Gothic with residual elements of Late Romanesque Caroline, neat and regular. Seemingly a single hand (which probably also did the rubrics); slightly more spacious in the first two quires than thereafter. Hebrew words are overlined, Greek words sometimes also—alternatively being supplied with a superscript transliteration. Quotations are signalled by diples running down the relevant margins. Nota marks apparently copied as part of the original transcription process (e.g. 44<sup>v</sup>, 45<sup>r</sup>, 62<sup>r</sup>, 104<sup>v</sup>). Corrections were first noted in the margin by two contemporary hands: one wrote in ink in a small, less formal script, heavily abbreviated; the other used lead or faint ink and wrote to the same scale as the original text; this hand also noted 'correctus' at the end of Q. III (18<sup>v</sup>, lower margin, gutter) and supplied a reference on 123<sup>r</sup> ('Orig' super leviticum omel' vii'). Then, where possible, the main text was rectified *in rasura* by the original scribe. In particularly long cases (e.g. 31<sup>r</sup>, 124<sup>r</sup>, 132<sup>v</sup>) the marginal note was then erased; otherwise it was just left. Running headings, giving the Book number, were supplied by correcting hand I up to 102<sup>r</sup>, but not thereafter. Also corrected were a few coloured initials, where the wrong letter had been supplied (e.g. 90<sup>v</sup>, 107<sup>v</sup>).

### DECORATION

Prologues and Books headed by 3- to 7-line-high initials, generally one colour, occasionally embellished with others: that to Book I (3<sup>r</sup>) is blue, yellow, and ochre; that for the prologue to Book XII (130<sup>v</sup>) is green with simple red flourishing. The initial for the general prologue (3<sup>r</sup>) was not supplied; that for the prologue to Book V (49<sup>v</sup>), originally 5 lines high, was redone at 4 lines high. A lead sketch guided the design of that on 16<sup>v</sup>, but there was seemingly no underdrawing for any of the others. Subsections are headed by plain initials, 2–3 lines high, alternately red then green (that on 74<sup>r</sup> was reduced in size from 3 to 2 lines high). Guide-letters for the initials in ink, guide-words for the rubric in ink (e.g. 105<sup>r</sup>) or lead (e.g. 52<sup>v</sup>, 53<sup>r</sup>).
